Choreographer Rosemary Lee in partnership with Dance North and Scottish Dance Theatre is looking for performers to get involved in her work **Threaded Fine**.

Threaded Fine is a durational performance gathering a cast of up to 24 professional / nonprofessional dancers of all ages. The piece will be created and presented twice, in both Dundee and Findhorn in green outdoor sites. Over a period of 5 hours, 24 solos (lasting 12mins each) will be performed like a relay, one after the other starting with the youngest dancer and ending with the oldest.

Continuing her passion for making large-scale inter-generational performances, Rosemary takes inspiration from the rhythmic, cyclical nature of life we are all subject to whilst also highlighting the singular individuality of each dancer. The audience are welcome to come and go or stay for the whole duration.

Threaded Fine will be created over a period of about six weeks. During this time Rosemary will work individually with each performer within small groups, nurturing and enabling each performer to find their particular quality for the solo. Renowned for her inclusive approach, Rosemary values all performers equally and the creative process is both relaxed yet inspiring for everyone.

The performance will be accompanied by a specially commissioned sound-score by composer and singer Isaac Lee-Kronick which combines sections of pre-recorded and live music.

Rosemary writes – "Threaded Fine will be performed within a delineated circle in the centre of the green space that only the dancers can enter. I see it as a repeating, revolving, individual ritual in

which moments of repetition and simplicity, intensity and stillness combine with the unique quality that each dancer brings to the solo.

There will be recognisable, repeating structures and movements but also tasks that each dancer will interpret slightly differently thus highlighting what inextricably binds us together and what makes each one of us distinct. I believe that dance as an art form can remind us of what it is to be human, to be alive in the moment."

Whatever your age and experience, this will be a unique and memorable opportunity to work with an inspiring artist alongside a fantastic of range performers to create and perform an innovative and high-quality performance.

"I am looking for performers who love to move and dance, who are interested in embodying and exploring images and qualities, who are curious about the sensation and energetic state of the movements they explore, who enjoy dancing with a wide range of dynamics and qualities and who are unafraid to dance solo.

You would need to be able to commit fully to the rehearsal and performance schedule. Please get in touch to find out more." Rosemary Lee

THE CAST

Although the most important requirement for this project is to love moving, it would be useful if participants have some experience of dance, movement or performing in public.

We are aiming to recruit the following approximate breakdown of performers:

- 6 performers 55-70+yrs

Performers will need to make their own travel arrangements to rehearsals and performances and organise their own accommodation.

We can offer details of travel options (incl car-shares/lifts) and local accommodation if required. We have a travel and accommodation fund, which will be allocated on a case-by-case basis depending on the need.

ACCESS

We can offer financial and practical help to support your access needs but please bear in mind the conditions as described above. Please also take into consideration:

- Some rehearsals and the performances will be taking place outside on grass.
- In the performances, you will be dancing alone in a circular area with the audience all around you.
- You will be learning set material, responding to and exploring tasks and very clear instructions guided and supported by Rosemary and the project team.
- You will be mostly rehearsing your solo in small groups so you will get individual attention. Sometimes you will be meeting and working together as a big ensemble of 24 people.
- Each solo will be approx. 9-10 mins long. Rosemary will work with each individual to make any choreographic adaptations if required.

The rehearsal spaces in Dundee and Findhorn will be fully accessible.

ABOUT

Rosemary Lee

Known for working in a variety of contexts and media, Rosemary creates large-scale site-specific works with cross-generational casts, solos for herself and other performers, video installations and short films. Her work is characterised by an interest in creating a moving portraiture of the performing individuals and communities she brings together, whilst also exploring and highlighting our relationship with our environment.

Her recent work includes **Square Dances** (Dance Umbrella) involving 150 performers in four London squares, **Under the Vaulted Sky** - a promenade work for 80 participants in a cathedral of trees for Milton Keynes International Festival, **Liquid Gold is the Air** (created with Roswitha Chesher)- an award winning video installation touring cathedrals and galleries, **Without**, a sevenscreen video installation capturing a panoramic view of the city of Derry/Londonderry as hundreds of participants move through the streets, **Calling Tree** (co directed with Simon Whitehead) which takes place in the canopies of urban trees, and **Passage for Par**(Groundwork, Cornwall) a durational work for 30 women slowly crossing tidal sands and **Circadian** (First Light Suffolk), the mother work to Threaded Fine first performed in Malta with ZfinMalta National Dance Company.

Rosemary's work is produced by Artsadmin.

She is also a Senior Research Fellow at C-DaRE Coventry University, holds an Honorary Doctorate from Roehampton University, and has an Honorary Fellowship from Trinity Laban. **rosemarylee**
